From Pastor Gary

Most of you are familiar with the story of the Sunday School teacher who asks the class "what is God's name"? One little boy raises his hand and says, "Andy". The teacher inquires and the little boy says, "Andy walks with Me. Andy talks with me." It's a cute story that tells the reality of Easter.

If you remember back to the first few chapters of Genesis, God was walking in the garden. I think from the beginning, God always wanted to walk with his creation. He went walking with Adam and Eve and he wants to walk along side of us.

On the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24: 13-35) Jesus came up along side of two disciples, one of whom was named Cleopas. Jesus came along side of them and walked with them.

One of the great things about going on a walk is the conversation. Amanda and I have made a lot of decisions and discussed many things on walks. Going on a walk with your spouse or a friend is a great way to improve a relationship and become closer.

A walk with God is the same. It improves your relationship. The more you go "walking with God" the closer you will become. As Jesus walked with these two disciples he taught them and opened the scriptures to them. They discovered that their hearts were burning within them as they walked and talked with Jesus.

On Easter we celebrate that Jesus rose from the dead-that He Lives. Jesus died for us and paid the penalty for our sins. The reality of Easter is that Jesus lives, he walks with us and he talks with us and He lives within our hearts.

I hope Jesus lives in you. I hope you go walking with Jesus and that your heart burns within you like it did with those two disciples who walked with Jesus.


Adult Sunday School Class on Sunday Morning!!

HISTORY NOTES

2005

As you are all aware, our church's 100th anniversary celebration is only about 5 months away and the history book that the History Committee has been preparing for the last year is

just weeks from being finalized and going to the printers. One of the more interesting sections of the book is the recollections of past members from the church's first 75 years. We have been featuring excerpts from this section during the past few months and we will continue doing so from time to time until the celebration.

The excerpt below was written by Phil Galbreath whose father, Rev. Clyde O. Galbreath, was our pastor during the years 1940 to 1949.

"Dad made a lot of improvements, such as the concrete front steps to the church. The street in front of the church and parsonage was always a lake when it rained. It was fun to play in, but Dad took his 4 ft x 4 ft trailer on a Model T frame and hauled enough sand and gravel to fill in the road. I remember a bridge over the drainage ditches at the corner in front of the church, where I rode my bike off and landed on my head. Dad had a grand plan to build a recreation center for the community with a house for a recreation director to live in, a tennis court, and a building to house a swimming pool and other recreation space. Much of the material for the house came from tearing down an old house. My dad was in the process of tearing down this old house when the roof rafters collapsed and knocked him off the wall, cutting a long gash across his left cheek and jaw. The tennis courts were finished and the house was nearing completion when the family left in June of 1949. I remember a crew working on the tennis courts when the concrete was poured. I do not remember anyone helping Dad with the house building, but from this perspective I have to believe he had help."

"Sadly, I don't remember much about specific people. I remember a lot of folks being around and having a hand in taking care of me. One of the few I do remember by name is Fred Ayers. He was a lawyer, and I remember him typing on his office typewriter with one finger from each hand, passing out bulletins at church, and then sitting on the chair at the back of the church and appearing to be asleep while leaning the chair against the door frame. I also remember Mr. Ayers at a committee meeting at the parsonage the night Dad had his face cut. Mr. Ayers appeared to be asleep and was snoring. Someone addressed a question to him. He seemed to gather himself together and answered as if he had not been sleeping or so the memory of an 8 or 9-year-old recalls."

As with almost all "Christian" holidays, Easter has been secularized and commercialized. The dichotomous nature of Easter and its symbols, however, is not necessarily a modern fabrication.

Since its conception as a holy celebration in the second century, Easter has had its non-religious side. In fact, Easter was originally a pagan festival.

The ancient Saxons celebrated the return of spring with an uproarious festival commemorating their goddess of offspring and of springtime, *Eastre*. When the second-century Christian missionaries encountered the tribes of the north with their pagan celebrations, they attempted to convert them to Christianity. They did so, however, in a clandestine manner.

It would have been suicide for the very early Christian converts to celebrate their holy days with observances that did not coincide with celebrations that already existed. To save lives, the missionaries cleverly decided to spread their religious message slowly throughout the populations by allowing them to continue to celebrate pagan feasts, but to do so in a Christian manner.

As it happened, the pagan festival of *Eastre* occurred at the same time of year as the Christian observance of the Resurrection of Christ. It made sense, therefore, to alter the festival itself, to make it a Christian celebration as converts were slowly won over. The early name, *Eastre*, was eventually changed to its modern spelling, Easter.
